Participants in ERC events are informed in the invitation or when they register whether photos/videos will be taken during the event and, if so, how they will be used. Participants are asked for their consent and informed that a reserved area in the meeting room is available for delegates who do not want to be filmed or taken in photograph. In case of networking events, participants who do not want to be filmed or taken in photograph receive a lanyard of a different colour.

Researchers funded by the ERC are asked for their approval before their image, photo and videos are published.

11	Recipients of the data	<p>Photos and audio-visual materials are stored in dedicated folders on the ERCEA network, to which access is restricted to staff members of the ERCEA Communications Unit.</p> <p>When video files exceed the size compatible with the ERCEA network, files are saved in external hard disks. Statements of release for photos and audio-visual material are saved in paper format in a dedicated folders accessible only to selected staff members of the communications unit and electronically on the ERCEA Network with the material concerned.</p> <p>Photos and audio-visual material may be sent to third parties, e.g. European Commission services, publishers, journalists, if data subjects have agreed via a statement of release or in writing for use on a particular occasion or for a specific article.</p>
